The City Council of the City of Cameron, Missouri met in Regular Session on Monday, the 2nd day of September 2014, at six o'clock p.m. at City Hall. Mayor Dennis M. Clark led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

Mayor Dennis M. Clark presided with the following Councilmembers present: Darlene Breckenridge, Jerri Ann Eddins, Ronnie Jack and William B. Rose-Heim. Absent: none.

Present were City Manager Mark Gaugh, Attorney for the City Mitch Elliott and City Clerk/Finance Clerk Barbara J. O'Connor.

Minutes of the August 18, 2014, Council Session were approved as submitted with a unanimous voice vote on motion made by Councilmember Breckenridge and seconded by Councilmember Eddins.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mayor Clark read a proclamation designating September as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in Cameron. Mayor Clark then presented the proclamation to several families in attendance whose lives have been affected by childhood cancer.

Mayor Clark read a proclamation designating September 17-23, 2014 as "Constitution Week 2014" in Cameron. The proclamation was requested by Missouri's Shoal Chapter DAR.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

1. Demolition Projects. Budgeted money remains in the demolition project line item and Staff plans to remove one (1) more house this fiscal year if the contractor can do the work. \$20,000 will be included in the 2014-2015 budget for more demolition projects. Staff will seek property owner's participation in future demolition projects.

2. Great Northwest Wholesale Water Commission (GNWWC). Engineers are working to complete the pipeline preliminary route for an environmental assessment. The line will not be designed until funding and construction contracts are in place.
3. Playground Equipment. New playground equipment is being installed at Recreation Park.
4. Water Plant Generator Project. Two (2) bids were received for the generator project. The bids will be evaluated and a recommendation made on the next step.
5. Name the Lakes. A sample of a mailer to be included with the October utility bills was included in the Council Packet.
6. Street Repairs. The trail east of Reservoir two (2) is half completed with asphalt. A portion of Ford Street has been prepared for asphalt overlay and Platte-Clay Way was overlaid last week.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Public Forum: Maintaining High Quality City Infrastructure and Services in an Era of Increasing Costs and Relatively Flat Revenue. Twenty-two citizens participated with Council in the Forum conducted by Councilmember Rose-Heim. The Forum divided into five (5) groups and discussed the following questions:

1. Why maintain/improve quality of life in Cameron?
2. Who else needs to be involved?
3. What does the future look like?
4. How might we help people get involved?
5. When are we ready to start?

The groups provided numerous responses to the questions. The responses are on file in the City Clerk's Office.
