The City Council of the City of Cameron, Missouri continued the November 17, 2014 Regular Session with a Collaborative Session on Tuesday, the 18th day of November 2014, at five o'clock p.m. at City Hall. Mayor Dennis M. Clark led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

Mayor Dennis M. Clark presided with the following Councilmembers present: Darlene Breckenridge, Ronnie Jack and William B. Rose-Heim. Absent: Jerri Ann Eddins.

Present were City Manager Mark Gaugh, Attorney for the City Mitch Elliott and City Clerk/Finance Clerk Barbara J. O'Connor.

Mayor Clark thanked those in attendance and noted the meeting is being held to address the issue of flat revenues while costs of providing City services continue to rise. In addressing the concerns Mayor Clark said the following is needed by the City of Cameron:

- maintain good paying jobs;
- attract people to move to Cameron;
- gain citizen retention; and,
- entice individuals employed in Cameron to want to live in Cameron.

Mayor Clark said all four needs also support existing businesses.

5:05 p.m. Councilmember Eddins arrived in the Council Chambers.

Councilmember Breckenridge addressed those in attendance asking that they consider doing one (1) or two (2) projects that would benefit the community but not cost of lot of money. Also, Councilmember Breckenridge reminded the group there could be maintenance costs involved with some of the projects and to consider how that expense might be handled.

Jamey McVicker said a Wine Art Festival is being planned by the Aiden McVicker Foundation for the second week in October, 2015.

Councilmember Rose-Heim moved to give City Manager Gaugh the ability to proceed on sign projects and other small projects. Mayor Clark seconded the motion. Discussion. A cost limit was discussed noting there is a \$15,000 limit on the City Managers authority. Prioritization needs to be established.

6:10 p.m. Councilmember Eddins excused herself from the meeting and left the Council Chambers.

Jack Randall suggested projects be ranked in terms of economic impact. Kathleen Randall said the Council could rank the projects and then ask the public for ranking input.

Following the discussion, Councilmember Rose-Heim withdrew his motion. Mayor Clark withdrew his second to the motion.

Councilmember Rose-Heim thanked all in attendance for their great ideas and direction.

City Attorney Elliott suggested a separate agenda item be included at each Council Session for a report on the projects and actions that might need to be taken.

There being no further business on motion made by Councilmember Breckenridge and seconded by Councilmember Jack, the Collaborative Meeting was adjourned at 6:25 p.m. on a unanimous voice vote.
