The City Council of the City of Cameron, Missouri met in Regular Session on Monday, the 1st day of June 2015, at six o'clock p.m. at City Hall. Mayor Dennis M. Clark led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

Mayor Dennis M. Clark presided with the following Councilmembers present: Darlene Breckenridge, Jerri Ann Eddins, Ronnie Jack and William B. Rose-Heim. Absent: none.

Present were City Manager Mark Gaugh, Attorney for the City Cale Griffin and City Clerk/Finance Clerk Barbara J. O'Connor.

Mayor Clark asked for a moment of silence to reflect on the life and death of City Attorney Mitch Elliott. Following the reflection time, Councilmember Rose-Heim offered a prayer in honor of City Attorney Elliott.

Mayor Clark announced Bill 2015-25, AN ORDINANCE STATING EXCEPTIONS TO SECTION 6-115. DRINKING IN PUBLIC ALLOWED, OF DIVISION 1. GENERALLY, OF ARTICLE V. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OF CHAPTER 6, LICENSES AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO PUBLIC SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF MALT LIQUOR AND WINE IN THE STREET AREA ON CHERRY STREET BETWEEN THIRD STREET AND SECOND STREET INCLUDING PUBLIC RIGHT A WAY WITHIN THE CITY OF CAMERON, MISSOURI (Crossroads Crush Festival) was removed from the agenda. Bill 2015-25 will be amended and placed on the next Council agenda.

Minutes of the May 18, 2015, Council Session were approved as submitted with a voice vote on motion made by Councilmember Breckenridge and seconded by Councilmember Rose-Heim. Councilmember Eddins and Councilmember Jack abstained from voting noting their absence for the May 18, 2015 Council Session.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Pat Watkins, 8875 SE Santa Rosa Road, Cameron, Missouri, asked Council to consider a Bill permitting utility terrain vehicle (UTV) (side by side vehicles), on City streets. Mr. Watkins suggested allowing this with a valid driver's license, proof of insurance and a city permit.

Steve Clay, 306 East Fourteenth Terrace, also spoke in favor of permitting UTV's on City Streets.

Jamey McVicker, 127 East Evergreen, said the Aiden McVicker Foundation is planning the Crossroad Crush Festival September 26, 2015. The event will include arts, music and a wine festival.

COMMUNITY PROJECT REPORT

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

1. City Manager Gaugh introduced Tim Hamilton, the new Community Development Director for the City.
2. Sidewalk Projects. Bids are being reviewed by Transystems Engineers on the two (2) sidewalk projects on Walnut Street. Both bids submitted were higher than the engineers' estimate.
3. AMI Project. Training on AMI will start June 9, 2015. The dispatch area in the Police Department is estimated to be complete around the end of June.
4. Street Maintenance and Construction Projects. Staff is getting pricing for street maintenance/repairs. The work is scheduled to be completed during the summer and fall months.
5. Public Works has scheduled a pothole patching machine/crack sealer demonstration unit June 10, 2015. Following the demonstration, Staff will determine if the unit meets City needs.
6. Air Show. The air show is scheduled for June 27 and 28, 2015. The Special Events Committee met with the air show coordinator and outlined required conditions. The event should be similar to previous air shows.
7. The Highway 36 Visitors Guide will include photographs from Cameron. The photographer was impressed with the US 36 Corridor.
8. Walnut Street. The final pay estimate has been sent to Amino Brothers along with a request for lien waivers. Amino is contesting the liquidated damages and the City is trying to resolve the issue.
9. Greenridge Senior Housing. Pete Ramsel has been trying to get a site approved in the City for senior housing. The last location was turned down, but Mr. Ramsel has a new site and will be requesting an endorsement from the Council.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Bill 2015-21, AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CITY OF CAMERON, CLINTON AND DeKALB COUNTIES, MISSOURI AUTHORIZING A MULTIPLE DOG CONDITIONAL

USE PERMIT FOR AMANDA GRAY AND DARREN LIMBACK ALLOWING TWO ADDITIONAL DOGS AT 602 NORTH WEST STREET, was read on third reading by title by City Clerk O'Connor. Copies of said Bill 2015-21 were available for the public. Motion was made by Councilmember Jack and seconded by Councilmember Eddins to pass said bill on third reading. Discussion. No additional information was presented. Bill 2015-21 passed by the following roll call vote: "Aye": Councilmembers: Breckenridge, Clark, Eddins, Jack and Rose-Heim. "Nay" none. The Mayor thereupon declared said bill duly adopted and said bill was numbered **ORDINANCE 5886**, was thereupon signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

NEW BUSINESS

Bill 2015-24, **AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OF THE CITY OF CAMERON, CLINTON AND DeKALB COUNTIES, MISSOURI TO ENTER INTO A TRANSPORTATION ENHANCEMENT FUNDS SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE MISSOURI HIGHWAYS & TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION FOR PEDESTRIAN ACCESS ON NORTH WALNUT STREET AND AT THE US 36 BRIDGE OVERPASS**, was read by title by City Clerk O'Connor. Copies of said Bill 2015-24 were available for the public. Motion was made by Councilmember Rose-Heim and seconded by Councilmember Eddins to pass said bill on first reading. Discussion. Public Works Director Drew Bontrager informed Council this is the second supplemental agreement for the project. The Missouri Department of Transportation has requested additional time for the project. This agreement revises the schedule to accommodate the request. Bill 2015-24 passed on first reading only with a unanimous voice vote
