

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A CITY SALES TAX FOR FIRE PROTECTION PURPOSES IN THE CITY OF CAMERON, CLINTON AND DEKALB COUNTIES, MISSOURI, AND PROVIDING FOR SUCH SALES TAX TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cameron, Clinton and DeKalb Counties, Missouri, under the authority of powers given to the City by the provisions of Section 321.242, RSMo, as amended (the “Act”), has determined that it is in the best interests of the City to impose a city sales tax for the operation of the municipal fire department of the City at the rate of one-fourth of one percent (1/4 of 1%) on the receipts from all retail sales within the City which are subject to taxation under Sections 144.010 to 144.525, inclusive, RSMo, with the intention that the revenues generated from such sales tax supplement the City’s general fund revenue that is otherwise annually appropriated for fire protection purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMERON, CLINTON AND DEKALB COUNTIES, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A city sales tax for the operation of the municipal fire department of the City at the rate of one-fourth of one percent (1/4 of 1%) on the receipts from all retail sales within the City of Cameron, Clinton and DeKalb Counties, Missouri, is hereby imposed upon all sellers within the City for the privilege of engaging in the business of selling tangible personal property or rendering taxable services at retail to the extent and in the manner provided by Sections 144.010 to 144.525, inclusive, RSMo, and the rules and regulations of the Director of Revenue of the State of Missouri issued pursuant thereto, said sales tax to terminate 20 years from the date on which such sales tax becomes effective. The tax shall not be effective until the terms and provisions of this Ordinance have been complied with.

Section 2. There shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Cameron, Clinton and DeKalb Counties, Missouri, at an election to be held in the City concurrently with the general municipal election on Tuesday, April 5, 2016, the following question:

QUESTION

“Shall the City of Cameron, Clinton and DeKalb Counties, Missouri, impose a sales tax at a rate one-fourth of one percent (1/4 of 1%) for the purpose of providing revenues for the operation of the municipal fire department, said sales tax to terminate 20 years from the date on which such sales tax becomes effective?”

Section 3. The form of Notice of Election containing the question of approval of this Ordinance, a copy of which is attached as **Exhibit A** hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to notify the County Clerks of Clinton and DeKalb Counties, Missouri, of the passage of this Ordinance no later than 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, January 26, 2016, and to include in said notification all of the terms and provisions required by Chapter 115, RSMo.

Section 4. If this Ordinance is approved by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified voters voting thereon at said election, the City Clerk shall as soon as possible after the election date (but in any event no later than ten (10) days after the election date) forward to the Director of Revenue of the State of Missouri by United States registered mail or certified mail (1) a certified copy of this Ordinance, including the Notice of Election attached hereto, and (2) a copy of the abstract of votes cast on the question at said election. The city sales tax for fire protection purposes and hereby imposed shall then become effective on October 1, 2016, and shall be levied and collected in the manner provided by the Act, by Sections 32.085 and 32.087, RSMo, as amended, and by all other applicable laws, and shall be used for the purposes hereinabove authorized.

Section 5. The City Council hereby determines that the revenue to be generated from the fire protection sales tax is necessary to supplement the general fund revenue that is otherwise annually appropriated for fire protection purposes. If the sales tax is approved by the voters, it is the intention of the City Council to continue to budget and appropriate general funds for fire protection purposes each year in a manner that is consistent with years prior to approval of the sales tax; provided, however, that such appropriation decisions in future years are required by law to be made in accordance with the City's normal procedures for such decisions by the then current City Council.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Read and passed on first reading only the 16th day of November 2015.

Read and passed on second reading this 7th day of December 2015.

Read and passed on third reading by roll call this 21st day of December 2015.
