

AN ORDINANCE STATING EXCEPTIONS TO SECTION 6-115. DRINKING IN PUBLIC ALLOWED, OF DIVISION 1. GENERALLY, OF ARTICLE V. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OF CHAPTER 6, LICENSES AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO PUBLIC SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF MALT LIQUOR AND WINE ON THIRD STREET FROM WALNUT TO CHERRY STREET, CHESTNUT STREET FROM THIRD STREET TO FOURTH STREET, CHERRY STREET FROM THIRD STREET TO FOURTH STREET, FOURTH STREET FROM CHESTNUT STREET TO CHERRY STREET AND McCORKLE PARK INCLUDING PUBLIC RIGHT A WAY WITHIN THE CITY OF CAMERON, MISSOURI (*Crossroads Crush Festival*)

WHEREAS, the Aiden McVicker Charitable Foundation will be hosting a local Music, Art, and Spirits Festival in the area of McCorkle Park and the downtown business district on Saturday, October 7, 2017 from 11:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. The festival will be called the ‘Crossroads Crush Festival’; and

WHEREAS, the Crossroads Crush Festival Committee asked that the Cameron City Council allow Festival visitors the ability to drink and purchase malt liquor (beer), wine, and/or mixed drinks in a designated area; and

WHEREAS, the Crossroads Crush Committee asked that the Cameron City Council limit the public consumption and sale of alcoholic beverages to a specific time and well-defined area during the Festival event.

WHEREAS, vendors duly licensed and authorized, intend to establish defined venues for public sale and consumption of malt liquor and wine; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cameron recognized the necessity of limiting public sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages of all types to well-defined areas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Cameron, Clinton, DeKalb, and Caldwell Counties, Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 6-115 of the revised Ordinances of the City of Cameron, which shall continue in full force and effect except for October 7, 2017 in the street area of Third Street from Walnut Street to Cherry Street; Chestnut Street from Third Street to Fourth Street; Cherry Street from Third Street to Fourth Street; Fourth Street from Chestnut Street to Cherry Street; and McCorkle Park. The described areas include sidewalks and Public Right a Way upon which there shall be permitted and authorization to a duly licensed applicant to sell alcohol on public property and to allow public consumption of alcohol on public property in accordance with a picnic license duly issued by the State of Missouri, the County of Clinton and the City of Cameron.

Section 2. The Mayor is authorized to sign this Ordinance.

Section 3. The City Clerk is directed to attest to the Mayor's signature.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
