The City Council of the City of Cameron, Missouri met in Special Session on Monday, the 12th day of April 2010, at five o'clock p.m. at City Hall. Mayor Everett W. Ice presided with the following Councilmembers present: Frank A. Buck, Mark L. Carr, Dennis M. Clark and Ronnie Jack. Absent: none.

Present were City Manager David Watson, Attorney for the City Mitch Elliott and City Clerk Barbara J. O'Connor.

Proclamation – Eagle Scout Zane Eric Clark. Mayor Ice read and presented a proclamation to Zane Eric Clark recognizing his accomplishments of attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. Clark is the son of Mike and Misty Clark of Cameron, Missouri. Eagle Scout Zane Eric Clark has demonstrated outstanding initiative, competence and success in his recent Eagle Scout Service Project, consisting of laying landscape tile and building picnic tables for the Cameron First Baptist Church playground area. Eagle Scout Zane Eric Clark received a standing ovation from the Council and citizens in the Council Chamber.

Mayor Ice took the opportunity to introduce his family, wife Pam and children Whitney, Nathan and Spencer, who were attending Mayor Ice's last meeting.

Minutes of the April 5, 2010, meeting were approved as submitted with a unanimous voice vote on motion made by Councilmember Buck and seconded by Councilmember Carr.

NEW BUSINESS

Bill 2010-29, AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD ON 6 APRIL 2010, FOR COUNCILMEMBER, IN THE CITY OF CAMERON, CLINTON AND DeKALB COUNTIES, MISSOURI, was read by title by City Clerk O'Connor. Copies of said Bill 2010-29 were available for the public. Motion was made by Councilmember Jack and seconded by Councilmember Clark to pass said bill on first reading. Discussion. A total of 566 votes were cast. There were seven (7) candidates and David Fry received 173 votes to win the election. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion was made by Councilmember Buck and seconded by Councilmember Carr to suspend the rules and place said bill on second reading. Discussion. None. Motion carried unanimously.

On motion made by Councilmember Jack and seconded by Councilmember Carr said bill was placed on second reading, was read by title and passed by the following roll call vote: “Aye”: Councilmembers: Buck, Carr, Clark, Ice and Jack. “Nay” none. The Mayor thereupon declared said bill duly adopted and said bill was numbered **ORDINANCE 5589**, was thereupon signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

Oath of Office. City Clerk O'Connor administered the oath of office to David Fry who then took a seat at the dais. Everett Ice was applauded by the entire Council and Chamber for his dedicated service to the City of Cameron. Mayor Ice left the dais and assumed a seat in the Council Chamber with his family.

Election of Mayor and Mayor Pro-Tem. City Clerk O'Connor entertained nominations for Mayor of the City of Cameron. Councilmember Jack nominated Councilmember Clark. There were no other nominations and Councilmember Clark was elected Mayor by a unanimous voice vote. City Clerk O'Connor entertained nominations for Mayor Pro-Tem. Councilmember Clark nominated Councilmember Jack. Councilmember Carr nominated Councilmember Buck. Comments were heard from all Councilmembers. Councilmember Jack was elected Mayor Pro-tem with a roll call vote: “Aye” Councilmembers, Clark, Fry and Jack. “Nay”: Councilmembers Buck and Carr.

MISCELLANEOUS

City Clerk O'Connor:

- Informed Council former Council candidate Keith Swindler has submitted his application to serve on the Cameron Planning and Zoning Commission.

Councilmember Fry:

- Thanked Everett Ice for his years of service to the City.
- Also thanked the voters for their support in his election and said he is looking forward to serving on the Council.

Councilmember Carr:

- Expressed his appreciation to Everett Ice for serving on the City Council.

Councilmember Buck:

- Congratulated Councilmember Fry on his election as well as Mayor Clark and Mayor Pro-Tem on their respective elections.

City Manager Watson presented Everett Ice with a gift certificate in appreciation of the three years Ice served the City.

There being no further business on motion made, seconded and carried, the meeting was adjourned at 5:30 p.m.
