The City Council of the City of Cameron, Missouri met in Special Session on Tuesday, the 9<sup>th</sup> day of June 2009, at seven thirty o'clock a.m. at City Hall. Mayor Everett W. Ice presided with the following Councilmembers present: Frank A. Buck, Mark L. Carr, Everett W. Ice and Ronnie Jack. Absent: Dennis M. Clark.

Present were City Manager David Watson and City Clerk Barbara J. O'Connor.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

**NEW BUSINESS**

Request for Permit to Use ATV on Public Streets. Captain Gaylen White, Cameron Police Department informed Council the NW MO Brain Tumor Support Group (HUGS) is hosting a special event in and around McCorkle Park the weekend of June 12-14. During this event, they want to use an all terrain vehicle to tow a kid's train around, at slow speeds, as an amusement ride.

Captain White noted City ordinance 7-340.1 prohibits the use of ATV's on city streets without a permit. City Ordinance 7-340.1 and Missouri State Law 304.013 allows city's governing bodies to issue special permits to operate ATV's on city streets. Staff recommended Council granting permission for the group to use an ATV around McCorkle Park. City Manager Watson said the streets will be closed off for the event and also stated the group does have insurance in place to cover the event. Councilmember Buck moved to allow the use of an ATV for the HUGS event. Councilmember Carr seconded the motion which passed with a unanimous voice vote. Absent: Councilmember Clark.

**Bill 2009-46, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF CAMERON, CLINTON AND DeKALB COUNTIES, MISSOURI AND CLINTON COUNTY, MISSOURI FOR A**

**JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM AWARD**, was read by title by City Clerk O'Connor. Copies of said Bill 2009-46 were available for the public. Motion was made by Councilmember Buck and seconded by Councilmember Jack to pass said bill on first reading. Discussion. Cameron Police Sergeant Martin Gray said this bill is requesting acceptance of a non-matching Federal grant for the City of Cameron and Clinton County. The grant money will be used to purchase equipment for surveillance activities for several multijurisdictional law enforcement agencies. The grant amount is \$10,393. Clinton County has agreed to participate and has signed the agreement. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: Councilmember Clark.

Motion was made by Councilmember Jack and seconded by Councilmember Carr to suspend the rules and place said bill on second reading. Discussion. None. Motion carried unanimously. Absent: Councilmember Clark.

On motion made by Councilmember Buck and seconded by Councilmember Jack said bill was placed on second reading, was read by title and passed by the following roll call vote: "Aye": Councilmembers: Buck, Carr, Ice and Jack. "Nay" none. Absent: Councilmember Clark. The Mayor thereupon declared said bill duly adopted and said bill was numbered **ORDINANCE 5514**, was thereupon signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

Presentation on Bird Population Mitigation. Public Works Director Bontrager informed Council of Staff intention to discharge firearms on City owned property at the Cameron Memorial Airport. Rock Doves, European Starlings and Ring Tailed Pigeons are causing problems with their nesting in the T-hangers at the airport. The Missouri Department of Conservation determined that none of the birds are protected species and that the City has the right to eradicate the nuisance birds. Two (2) certified police officers will be using firearms during daylight hours to mitigate the birds.
