2011 K9 Statistics


K-9 Ex is the current canine for the Cameron Police Department. K-9 Ex is a three-year-old German Shepherd who is trained in narcotics, tracking and police protection. Officer Chubick and K-9 Ex have worked together as a K-9 team for approximately one and a half years. K-9 Ex is another tool the department can utilize to assist with narcotic searches, suspect apprehension, building searches and felony warrant services.

In 2011, the Cameron K-9 team was utilized approximately 84 times within the city as well as assisting outside agencies. Within the last year, the Cameron K-9 team has assisted various agencies to include the Trenton Police Department, Hamilton Police Department, Missouri State Highway Patrol, and Sheriff's Departments from Livingston, Ray, and Clinton Counties. K-9 Ex and Officer Chubick were contacted to conduct a track on an elderly male who had walked away from a local nursing home as well as a missing child with specials needs.

During the winter of 2011, the Cameron K-9 team assisted Clinton County Sheriff's Department with a search for an individual who had fled the scene from a vehicle accident just west of the city limits. K-9 Ex followed a positive track through a muddy and snowy field until the search was terminated. The suspect was later located hiding in a residence less than 1/4 of a mile from where the search had been terminated.

In the summer of 2011, Detectives towed a vehicle to the Cameron Police Department to complete a

search of the vehicle in hopes of locating an illegal substance. After Detectives had conducted a search of the vehicle and came up empty handed, K-9 Ex was asked to conduct a sniff of the vehicle. After a sniff of the vehicle was conducted, K-9 Ex located marijuana in the floor-board on the passenger side.
